Educator Information and Directions

This PDF contains the assessment project for our "Descriptive Writing" unit. Students will get the opportunity to show the skills they have accumulated throughout the unit. They will write an essay that involves using imagery and figurative language to create engaging and powerful writing.

DAY 1

- Use the **Brainstorm** page and choose a prompt for your short essay.
- ☐ Plan your writing details about your subject on the **Picture It!** page.
- Use the **Graphic Organizer** to plan the figurative language and imagery you will use to fulfill your chosen prompt.

DAY 2

- Use the **Outline** pages to complete a rough draft of your essay.
- Use the **How to Proofread Your Work** page to mark your essay and locate areas for improvement.

DAY 3

- Use the Final Draft pages to create the final version of your essay. You may also type it on the computer, if available.
- Use the Rubric page to grade your work yourself, or have a friend or loved one grade it for you.

Suggestions for Support

Writing Alternatives

- Show-and-Tell: Create a slideshow and deliver a show-and-tell presentation that describes your chosen topic.
- A Description Through Short Film: Create phrases using imagery to describe your subject. Then record and edit a short film about your subject. Make sure to use lighting, sound, and other elements to evoke the appropriate emotion.

Students may use more time than suggested for this assignment, as it could take three to five days depending on their comfort level. They may also do additional brainstorming by making two copies of the **Graphic Organizer** on p. 4.

Students are also welcome to use prior writing from other PDFs and lessons and add imagery and figurative language to it. They can use their own prior writing as long as it can fulfill the prompt requirements and it is not taken from another source. Please keep in mind that students will most likely have to add to their formerly used writing to achieve high scores on this assignment.

- 1. Describe a place that holds special meaning to you. Use imagery and figurative language to convey the emotions and sensory details associated with it.
- 2. Use imagery and figurative language to describe a transformative or significant experience in your life. Use your writing to illustrate the change that took place.
- 3. Use imagery and figurative language to describe a person, object, or animal that you have a strong emotional connection with.

How to Proofread Your Work

STEP ONE:

Read through your writing from Day 2 on pp. 5-6. Mark the following on your pages when you spot them:

Simile - Mark in pink
Metaphor - Mark in blue
Hyperbole - Mark in purple
Personification - Mark in green
Underline imagery

STEP TWO:

After you mark your writing, scan through your story and make sure you have the elements above (simile, metaphor, hyperbole, personification, underlined examples of imagery).

1.	Was there any element that you felt you provided many examples of?
2.	Was there any element you found that you should add more of to your writing?

STEP THREE:

Rewrite your essay and add anything you felt that you were lacking in your first draft on pp. 5-6. Complete your final draft on pp. 8-9 or you can type it on the computer.
