

#### **Extension Activities**

Your Story's Event Map :: Use your artistic skills to create a colorful map of major and minor events from your book. You can draw it out, use computer tools, or even craft it! Think of it like a treasure map — what are the big "X-marks-the-spot" moments, and what are the smaller steps leading there?

Setting the Scene : Remember how the setting of a story can help create feelings, mood, and atmosphere? Create a poem, song, or video to help express the feelings you get from your novel's setting!




## My Plot Diagram
